We are pleased and proud of the hard work and success of the students at Lake County Baptist School. One indication of this success is the achievement test results which show our students consistently testing well above the national average of the 50th percentile. The following graph demonstrates this by comparing our annual average percentile ranking in each grade level over the last several years to the national average and illustrates the consistency with which our students perform over time.

However, although academic excellence is critical, it is not the only or even most important factor in a child's education. Building Christian character, instilling moral values, and establishing biblical ethics are distinguishing marks of a Christian education as we endeavor to assist parents in shaping the life of a young person. This sets Christian education apart from a secular education.
