HANNAH AT PRAYER 1 SAM. 1:9-28

<u>Acts 3:22</u> For Moses truly said unto the fathers, A prophet shall the Lord your God raise up unto you of your brethren, like unto me; him shall ye hear in all things whatsoever he shall say unto you. <u>Acts 3:23</u> And it shall come to pass, that every soul, which will not hear that prophet, shall be destroyed from among the people.

<u>Acts 3:24</u> Vea, and all the prophets from <u>Samuel</u> and those that follow after, as many as have spoken, have likewise foretold of these days.

Acts 13:20 And after that he gave unto them judges about the space of four hundred and fifty years, **until Samuel the prophet**. <u>Hebrews 11:32</u> And what shall I more say? for the time would fail me to tell of Gedeon, and of Barak, and of Samson, and of Jephthae; of David also, **and Samuel**, and of the prophets: <u>Hebrews 11:33</u> Who through faith subdued kingdoms, wrought righteousness, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions,

The story of Samuel, on the whole, is one of godliness, excellence & of a great follower....

- Transitional figure between judges and prophets
- A prophet, priest & judge!
- Last of the judges
- First of the prophets

That's what happened – that's the actual story.

But it could have been so different!

Hannah was in a <u>crucible</u> – an extreme test &/ crisis! The identical crucible we find ourselves in quite often with the <u>3 identical choices</u>:

- 1. Striking back in anger
- 3. Reaching out in prayer

- 2. Shutting down in bitterness
- 4. Running off

Obviously Hannah reaches out & up in prayer!

I. For Hannah, prayer is based upon certain assumptions

<u>1 Samuel 1:3</u> And this man went up out of his city yearly to worship and to sacrifice unto the LORD of hosts in Shiloh.... <u>1 Samuel 1:7</u> And as he did so year by year, when she went up to the house of the LORD, so she provoked her; therefore she wept, and did not eat. <u>1 Samuel 1:9</u> So Hannah rose up after they had eaten in Shiloh, and after they had drunk.... <u>1 Samuel 1:10</u> And she was in bitterness of soul, and prayed unto the LORD, and wept sore.

For many, prayer is <u>never</u> a real, viable option \rightarrow even as believers this option is taken of the table. Striking back / shutting down become the only options!

The text indicates Elkanah's family, although imperfect, were strong believers!

Assumptions:

- God exists
- > God is personal \rightarrow capable of having relationships with you
- > God can be worshipped
- ➢ God is interested in people!

<u>1 Peter 5:7</u> Casting all your care upon him; for he careth for you.

Psalm 55:22 Cast thy burden upon the LORD, and he shall sustain thee: he shall never suffer the righteous to be moved.

> God is interested in Hannah and her little problems

<u>Matthew 10:29</u> Are not two sparrows sold for a farthing? and one of them shall <u>not</u> fall on the ground without your Father. <u>Matthew 10:30</u> But the very hairs of your head are all numbered. <u>Matthew 10:31</u> Fear ye not therefore, ye are of more value than many sparrows.

God can hear & can answer prayer

<u>Psalm 65:2</u> O thou that hearest prayer, unto thee shall all flesh come.

Matthew 7:7 Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you: Matthew 7:8 For every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened. Matthew 7:9 Or what man is there of you, whom if his son ask bread, will he give him a stone? Matthew 7:10 Or if he ask a fish, will he give him a serpent? Matthew 7:11 If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children, how much more shall your Father which is in heaven give good things to them that ask him?

Ephesians 3:20 Now unto him that is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that worketh in us, **Ephesians 3:21** Unto him be glory in the church by Christ Jesus throughout all ages, world without end. Amen.

> The Lord of hosts will come to the aid of the girl from the hills!

<u>**1** Samuel 1:11</u> And she vowed a vow, and said, **O LORD of hosts**, if thou wilt indeed look on the affliction of thine handmaid, and remember me, and not forget thine handmaid, but wilt give unto thine handmaid a man child, then I will give him unto the LORD all the days of his life, and there shall no razor come upon his head.

II. For Hannah, prayer is born out of deep pain

<u>1 Samuel 1:6</u> And her adversary also **provoked her sore, for to make her fret**, because the LORD had shut up her womb. **<u>1 Samuel</u> <u>1:7</u>** And as he did so year by year, when she went up to the house of the LORD, **so she provoked her; therefore she wept, and did <u>not eat.</u> <u>1 Samuel 1:9</u>** So Hannah rose up after they had eaten in Shiloh, and after they had drunk. Now Eli the priest sat upon a seat by a post of the temple of the LORD. **<u>1 Samuel 1:10</u>** And she was **in bitterness of soul**, and prayed unto the LORD, and **wept sore**. **<u>1</u> <u>Samuel 1:15</u>** And Hannah answered and said, No, my lord, **I am a woman of a sorrowful spirit**: I have drunk neither wine nor strong drink, but have poured out my soul before the LORD. **<u>1 Samuel 1:16</u>** Count not thine handmaid for a daughter of Belial: for **out of the abundance of my complaint and grief have I spoken hitherto.**

We, as Christians, <u>know</u> certain things about prayer:

- Christians pray
- Christians pray regularly
- > Christians gather together and pray
- Christians are taught to pray and even how to pray!
- > Christians struggle to pray! (That is with fervor, passion, attention....)
- > Christians "sometimes" fail to pray while / when praying!
- > Christians then discipline their prayer time: a time(s), location(s), & a list
- > Christians pray best & most out of deep pain and distress
- > The deep pain & distress **doesn't** have to be your own

Romans 12:15 Rejoice with them that do rejoice, and weep with them that weep.

<u>1 Timothy 2:1</u> I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, **intercessions**, and **giving of thanks, be made <u>for</u> all men; <u>1</u> <u>Timothy 2:2 For</u> kings, and <u>for</u> all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty**

III. For Hannah, prayer is backed-up by vows

<u>1 Samuel 1:11</u> And she vowed a vow, and said, O LORD of hosts, <u>if</u> thou wilt indeed look on the affliction of thine handmaid, and remember me, and not forget thine handmaid, but wilt give unto thine handmaid a man child, <u>then</u> I will give him unto the LORD all the days of his life, and there shall no razor come upon his head.

<u>1 Samuel 1:17</u> Then Eli answered and said, Go in peace: **and the God of Israel grant thee thy petition that thou hast asked of him. <u>1 Samuel 1:19...</u> and Elkanah knew Hannah his wife; and the LORD remembered her. <u>1 Samuel 1:20</u>** Wherefore it came to pass, ... that she bare a son, **and called his name Samuel, saying, <u>Because</u> I have asked him of the LORD. <u>1 Samuel 1:21</u>** And the man Elkanah, and all his house, went up to offer unto the LORD the yearly sacrifice, and his vow. <u>1 Samuel 1:22</u> But Hannah went <u>not</u> **up; for she said unto her husband, I will <u>not</u> go up until the child be weaned, and then I will bring him, that he may appear before the LORD, and there abide for ever. <u>1 Samuel 1:23</u> And Elkanah her husband said unto her, Do what seemeth thee good;** tarry until thou have weaned him; **only the LORD establish his word.** So the woman abode, and gave her son suck until she weaned him.

<u>1 Samuel 1:24</u> And when she had weaned him, she took him up with her.... <u>1 Samuel 1:25</u> And they slew a bullock, and brought the child to Eli. <u>1 Samuel 1:26</u> And she said, Oh my lord, as thy soul liveth, my lord, **I am the woman that stood by thee here**, **praying unto the LORD.** <u>1 Samuel 1:27</u> For this child I prayed; and the LORD hath given me my petition which I asked of him: <u>1 Samuel 1:28 Therefore</u> also I have lent him to the LORD; as long as he liveth he shall be lent to the LORD....

Prayer changes things!
