LESSONS IN LEADERSHIP 1 SAM. 7:15-17; 8:1-22

Samuel was unique:

- > Prophet, priest, & judge
- > National figure
- > Faithful judge

None of us are Samuel **but** all of us have leadership roles!

What activities do we find?

I. Stemming the tide / filling the gap!

1 Samuel 7:15 And Samuel judged Israel all the days of his life. 1 Samuel 7:16 And he went from year to year in circuit to Bethel, and Gilgal, and Mizpeh, and judged Israel in all those places. 1 Samuel 7:17 And his return was to Ramah; for there was his house; and there he judged Israel; and there he built an altar unto the LORD.

Ezekiel 22:30 And I sought for a man among them, that should make up the hedge, and stand in the gap before me for the land, that I should not destroy it: but I found none.

Psalm 106:23 Therefore he said that he would destroy them, had not Moses his chosen stood before him in the breach, to turn away his wrath, lest he should destroy them.

Psalm 106:30 Then stood up Phinehas, and executed judgment: and so the plague was stayed.

II. Dealing with disappointment

1 Samuel 8:1 And it came to pass, when Samuel was old, that he made his sons judges over Israel. 1 Samuel 8:2 Now the name of his firstborn was Joel; and the name of his second, Abiah: they were judges in Beersheba. 1 Samuel 8:3 And his sons walked not in his ways, but turned aside after lucre, and took bribes, and perverted judgment.

1 Samuel 8:4 Then all the elders of Israel gathered themselves together, and came to Samuel unto Ramah, 1 Samuel 8:5 And said unto him, Behold, thou art old, and thy sons walk not in thy ways: now make us a king to judge us like all the nations.

1 Samuel 8:6 But the thing displeased Samuel, when they said, Give us a king to judge us. And Samuel prayed unto the LORD.

Leaders always have disappointments:

- > Your plans fail
- > You children...fail / are not you
- > Your followers don't follow / grow
- Your followers follow the world

1 Samuel 8:5 And said unto him, Behold, thou art old, and thy sons walk not in thy ways: now make us a king to judge us like all the nations. 1 Samuel 8:6 But the thing displeased Samuel, when they said, Give us a king to judge us. And Samuel prayed unto the

The issue wasn't kingship but who, when & why

Thoughts:

- > You will be disappointed
- You must not **become** disappointed in people / the Lord
- ➤ You must take your disappointment to the Lord → repeatedly!!!

1 Samuel 8:6 But the thing displeased Samuel, when they said, Give us a king to judge us. And Samuel prayed unto the LORD. 1 Samuel 8:21 And Samuel heard all the words of the people, and he rehearsed them in the ears of the LORD.

You must actually leave your disappointment with the Lord

<u>1 Samuel 8:7</u> And the LORD said unto Samuel, <u>Hearken</u> unto the voice of the people in all that they say unto thee: for they have not rejected thee, but they have rejected me, that I should not reign over them.

1 Samuel 8:9 Now therefore **hearken** unto their voice: howbeit yet protest solemnly unto them, and shew them the manner of the king that shall reign over them.

<u>1 Samuel 8:22</u> And the LORD said to Samuel, <u>Hearken</u> unto their voice, and make them a king. And Samuel said unto the men of Israel, Go ye every man unto his city.

1 Peter 5:7 Casting all your care upon him; for he careth for you.

<u>Psalm 55:22</u> Cast thy burden upon the LORD, <u>and</u> he shall sustain thee: he shall never suffer the righteous to be moved.

> You must understand what's really happening

<u>1 Samuel 8:7</u> And the LORD said unto Samuel, Hearken unto the voice of the people in all that they say unto thee: <u>for</u> they have not rejected thee, <u>but</u> they have rejected me, <u>that</u> I should not reign over them.

III. Speaking the truth

<u>1 Samuel 8:9</u> Now therefore <u>hearken</u> unto their voice: <u>howbeit</u> yet protest solemnly unto them, and shew them the manner of the king that shall reign over them.

1 Samuel 8:10 And Samuel told all the words of the LORD unto the people that asked of him a king. 1 Samuel 8:11 And he said, This will be the manner of the king that shall reign over you: He will take your sons, and appoint them for himself, for his chariots, and to be his horsemen; and some shall run before his chariots. 1 Samuel 8:12 And he will appoint him captains over thousands, and captains over fifties; and will set them to ear his ground, and to reap his harvest, and to make his instruments of war, and instruments of his chariots. 1 Samuel 8:13 And he will take your daughters to be confectionaries, and to be cooks, and to be bakers. 1 Samuel 8:14 And he will take your fields, and your vineyards, and your oliveyards, even the best of them, and give them to his servants. 1 Samuel 8:15 And he will take the tenth of your seed, and of your vineyards, and give to his officers, and to his servants. 1 Samuel 8:16 And he will take your menservants, and your maidservants, and your goodliest young men, and your asses, and put them to his work. 1 Samuel 8:17 He will take the tenth of your sheep: and ye shall be his servants. 1 Samuel 8:18 And ye shall cry out in that day because of your king which ye shall have chosen you; and the LORD will not hear you in that day.

<u>1 Samuel 8:19</u> Nevertheless the people <u>refused</u> to obey the voice of Samuel; and they said, Nay; but we will have a king over us; <u>1 Samuel 8:20</u> That we also may be like all the nations; and that our king may judge us, and go out before us, and fight our battles.

2 Timothy 4:2 Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine.

2 Timothy 4:3 For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears; 2 Timothy 4:4 And they shall turn away their ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables.

IV. Accepting your role &/ limitations

<u>1 Samuel 8:19</u> Nevertheless the people refused to obey the voice of Samuel; and they said, Nay; but we will have a king over us; <u>1</u> Samuel 8:20 That we also may be like all the nations; and that our king may judge us, and go out before us, and fight our battles.
