THE PROPHET AND HIS PEOPLE (3) 1 SAM. 12:16-25

An OT prophet (NT prophet also) \neq pastor. There are many similarities and overlap of functions. What should God's people expect?

4 expectations:

I. Affirmation when possible!

<u>1 Samuel 12:19</u> And all the people said unto Samuel, Pray for thy servants unto the LORD thy God, that we die not: <u>for</u> we have added unto all our sins this evil, to ask us a king.

<u>1 Samuel 12:20</u> And Samuel said unto the people, Fear <u>not</u>: ye have done all this wickedness: yet turn not aside from following the LORD, but serve the LORD with all your heart; <u>1 Samuel 12:22</u> For the LORD will not forsake his people for his great name's sake: <u>because</u> it hath pleased the LORD to make you his people.

What does affirmation look like? A combination of praise, affirming looks, greetings and hope!

A Pastor's personal thoughts:

- > This is easy to do for the obedient
- > This is fairly easy to do for new Christians and youth

Stumbling now but we are going to get it!

So much hope for change and the future!

- > Difficult / very difficult for the deliberately disobedient
- > Almost impossible for the deliberately disobedient over time!

So...!

What can I (we as Christians) do / offer people?

- ➤ Hope → an honest hope
- **▶** Hope through repentance & obedience
- **➤** Hope for the future
- ➤ Hope in &/ from God!!!

<u>1 Samuel 12:22</u> For the LORD will <u>not</u> forsake his people <u>for</u> his great name's sake: <u>because</u> it hath pleased the LORD to make you his people.

Psalm 25:11 For thy name's sake, O LORD, pardon mine iniquity; for it is great.

<u>Psalm 79:5</u> How long, LORD? wilt thou be angry for ever? shall thy jealousy burn like fire?

Psalm 79:6 Pour out thy wrath upon the heathen that have not known thee, and upon the kingdoms that have not called upon thy

<u>Psalm 79:7</u> For they have devoured Jacob, and laid waste his dwelling place.

Psalm 79:8 O remember not against us former iniquities: let thy tender mercies speedily prevent us: for we are brought very low.

<u>Psalm 79:9</u> Help us, O God of our salvation, for the glory of thy name: and deliver us, and purge away our sins, for thy name's sake.

<u>Psalm 106:8</u> Nevertheless he saved them for his name's sake, that he might make his mighty power to be known.

<u>Psalm 143:10</u> Teach me to do thy will; for thou art my God: thy spirit is good; lead me into the land of uprightness. <u>Psalm 143:11</u> Quicken me, O LORD, <u>for</u> thy name's sake: for thy righteousness' sake bring my soul out of trouble.

Isaiah 48:9 For my name's sake will I defer mine anger, and for my praise will I refrain for thee, that I cut thee not off.

Daniel 9:18 O my God, incline thine ear, and hear; open thine eyes, and behold our desolations, and the city which is called by thy name: for we do not present our supplications before thee for our righteousnesses, but for thy great mercies. Daniel 9:19 O Lord, hear; O Lord, forgive; O Lord, hearken and do; defer not, for thine own sake, O my God: for thy city and thy people are called by thy name.

II. Instruction as commanded!

<u>1 Samuel 12:23</u> Moreover as for me, God forbid that I should sin against the LORD in ceasing to pray for you: <u>but</u> I will teach you the good and the right way: <u>1 Samuel 12:24</u> Only fear the LORD, and serve him in truth with all your heart: for consider how great things he hath done for you. <u>1 Samuel 12:25</u> But if ye shall still do wickedly, ye shall be consumed, both ye and your king. <u>Deuteronomy 24:8</u> Take heed in the plague of leprosy, that thou observe diligently, and do according to all that the priests the Levites shall teach you: as I commanded them, so ye shall observe to do.

<u>Deuteronomy 33:10</u> They shall teach Jacob thy judgments, and Israel thy law: they shall put incense before thee, and whole burnt sacrifice upon thine altar.

Acts 20:17 And from Miletus he sent to Ephesus, and called the elders (τοὺς πρεσβυτέρους τῆς ἐκκλησίας) of the church. Acts 20:28 Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all the flock, over the which the Holy Ghost hath made you overseers (ἐπισκόπους), to feed (ποιμαίνειν) the church of God, which he hath purchased with his own blood.

2 Timothy 4:1 I charge thee therefore before God, and the Lord Jesus Christ, who shall judge the quick and the dead at his appearing and his kingdom; 2 Timothy 4:2 Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine. 2 Timothy 4:3 For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears; 2 Timothy 4:4 And they shall turn away their ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables.

1 Peter 5:1 The elders (Πρεσβυτέρους) which are among you I exhort, who am also an elder, and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, and also a partaker of the glory that shall be revealed: 1 Peter 5:2 Feed (ποιμάνατε) the flock of God which is among you, taking the oversight (ἐπισκοποῦντες) thereof, not by constraint, but willingly; not for filthy lucre, but of a ready mind; 1 Peter 5:3 Neither as being lords over God's heritage, but being ensamples to the flock. 1 Peter 5:4 And when the chief Shepherd shall appear, ye shall receive a crown of glory that fadeth not away.

III. Intercession as expected &/ needed!

<u>1 Samuel 12:13</u> Now therefore behold the king whom ye have chosen, and whom ye have desired! and, behold, the LORD hath set a king over you. <u>1 Samuel 12:23</u> Moreover as for me, God forbid that I should sin against the LORD in ceasing to pray for you: but I will teach you the good and the right way:

Thoughts:

- ➤ They have rejected Samuel → as the leader
- > Worse, they have rejected the Lord
- > Samuel isn't positive about where this will end up
- ➤ He will continue to pray anyway!
- ➤ He will also continue to beg God for His best

Acts 6:4 But we will give ourselves continually to prayer, and to the ministry of the word.

<u>1 Timothy 2:1</u> I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men; <u>1 Timothy 2:2</u> For kings, and for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty.

Exodus 32:33 Exodus 32:30-32; Numbers 11:2; Numbers 21:7; Deuteronomy 9:20; Deuteronomy 9:26

IV. Correction when necessary / needed!

<u>1 Samuel 12:20</u> And Samuel said unto the people, Fear <u>not</u>: ye have done all this wickedness: yet turn not aside from following the LORD, but serve the LORD with all your heart;

<u>1 Samuel 12:21</u> And turn ye <u>not</u> aside: <u>for</u> then should ye go after vain things, which **cannot** profit nor deliver; for they are vain. <u>1</u> <u>Samuel 12:24</u> Only fear the LORD, and serve him in truth with all your heart: for consider how great things he hath done for you. <u>1</u> <u>Samuel 12:25</u> But <u>if</u> ye shall still do wickedly, ye shall be consumed, both ye and your king.

With age this becomes more difficult:

- ➤ Like people
- ➤ Want what's best for people
- > Don't see as much / can't see as much / don't want to see as much!
