FINDING OUT "YOU ARE THE MAN!" 2 SAM. 12:1-7a

Pray, witness, listen...repeat...

Why don't we see <u>Our</u> guilt? Why do we never get to <u>Our</u> issues?

I. The tendency to identify with the good guy & not the bad guy!

<u>2 Samuel 12:1</u> And the LORD sent Nathan unto David. And he came unto him, and said unto him, There were **two men** in **one city**; the one rich, and the other poor.

<u>2 Samuel 12:2</u> The <u>rich man</u> had exceeding many flocks and herds:

<u>2 Samuel 12:3</u> But the **poor man** had nothing, save one little ewe lamb, which he had bought and nourished up: and it grew up together with him, and with his children; it did eat of his own meat, and drank of his own cup, and lay in his bosom, and was unto him as a daughter.

<u>2 Samuel 12:4</u> And there came **<u>a traveller</u>** unto the rich man, and he spared to take of his own flock and of his own herd, to dress for the wayfaring man that was come unto him; but took the poor man's lamb, and dressed it for the man that was come to him.

<u>2 Samuel 12:5</u> And **David's anger** was greatly kindled against the man; and he said to Nathan, As the LORD liveth, the man that hath done this thing shall surely die:

Now that you know the story - who was most similar to David? The Rich

Thoughts (David doesn't walk, jog, or run but sprints full-tilt / all in):

- ➤ We are the good guys of course!
- We certainly see ourselves / identify as Good!
- > We almost **never** see ourselves as bad
- ➢ If we see ourselves as bad → it is only relative bad: bad but not bad

A <u>simple / transforming suggestion</u>: **Read / hear** every Biblical story through the eyes of all the participants.

<u>Matthew 26:20</u> Now when the even was come, he sat down with the twelve. <u>Matthew 26:21</u> And as they did eat, he said, Verily I say unto you, that **one of you shall betray me**. <u>Matthew 26:22</u> And they were exceeding sorrowful, and began every one of them to say unto him, Lord ($\kappa \circ \rho \iota \varepsilon$), is it I? <u>Matthew</u> <u>26:23</u> And he answered and said, He that dippeth his hand with me in the dish, the same shall betray me. <u>Matthew 26:24</u> The Son of man goeth as it is written of him: but woe unto that man by whom the Son of man is betrayed! it had been good for that man if he had not been born. <u>Matthew 26:25</u> Then Judas, which betrayed him, answered and said, Master ($\dot{\rho} \alpha \beta \beta \hat{\iota}$), is it I? He said unto him, Thou hast said.

<u>Matthew 20:20</u> Then came to him the mother of Zebedee's children with her sons, worshipping him, and desiring a certain thing of him. <u>Matthew 20:21</u> And he said unto her, **What wilt thou?** She saith unto him, Grant that these <u>my two sons</u> may sit, the one on thy right hand, and the other on the left, in thy kingdom.

<u>Matthew 20:22</u> But Jesus answered and said, Ye know not what ye ask.... <u>Matthew 20:24</u> And when <u>the ten</u> heard it, they were moved with indignation against the two brethren.

II. The <u>tendency</u> to judge others & <u>not</u> judge ourselves

[The tendency to judge others long before judging ourselves]

<u>2 Samuel 12:5</u> And <u>David's anger</u> was greatly kindled against the man; and he said to Nathan, As the LORD liveth, the man that hath done this thing shall surely die: <u>2 Samuel 12:6</u> And he shall restore the lamb fourfold, because he did this thing, and because he had no pity.

Thoughts:

It's easier to see others' sins!

> It's far easier to condemn others' sins

<u>2 tests:</u> 1. The bad breath test 2. The white shirt test

> It is so much easier to magnify others' sins

2"x4" & the toothpick!David: He took the guys favorite...all I did was take the man's wife...,& well...his life!!!

<u>Matthew 7:1</u> Judge <u>not</u>, that ye be not judged.

<u>Matthew 7:2</u> For with what judgment ye judge, ye shall be judged: <u>and</u> with what measure ye mete, it shall be measured to you again.

<u>Matthew 7:3</u> And <u>why</u> beholdest thou the mote that is in thy brother's eye, <u>but</u> considerest not the beam that is in thine own eye?

<u>Matthew 7:4</u> Or how wilt thou say to thy brother, Let me pull out the mote out of thine eye; <u>and</u>, behold, a beam is in thine own eye?

<u>Matthew 7:5</u> Thou hypocrite, <u>first</u> cast out the beam out of thine own eye; and <u>then</u> shalt thou see clearly to cast out the mote out of thy brother's eye.

I call this the "Bill Clinton" principle:

III. The tendency to be harsher & rasher with others than with ourselves

<u>2 Samuel 12:5</u> And David's anger was greatly kindled against the man; and he said to Nathan, As the LORD liveth, the man that hath done this thing shall surely die: **<u>2 Samuel 12:6</u>** And he shall restore the lamb fourfold, because he did this thing, and **<u>because</u>** he had no pity. **<u>2 Samuel 12:7</u>** And Nathan said to David, Thou art the man.

Luke 6:35 But love ye your enemies, and do good, and lend, hoping for nothing again; and your reward shall be great, and ye shall be the children of the Highest: for he is kind unto the unthankful and to the evil.

Luke 6:36 Be ye therefore merciful, as your Father also is merciful.

Luke 6:37 Judge **not**, and ye shall **not** be judged: condemn **not**, and ye shall **not** be condemned: forgive, and ye shall be forgiven:

<u>Luke 6:38</u> Give, and it shall be given unto you; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over, shall men give into your bosom. <u>For</u> with the same measure that ye mete withal it shall be measured to you again.
