# WHAT HAPPENS WHEN WE DON'T FORGIVE? MT. 6:14-15

Regardless of the clear teaching of Scripture and clear teaching and preaching of the same – some will not forgive.

# So, what are the <u>consequences</u>?

# 1. A spiritual dead-end

<u>Matthew 6:14</u> For <u>if</u> ye forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you: <u>Matthew 6:15</u> <u>But if</u> ye forgive <u>not</u> men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.

#### Thoughts:

- This text is a hard text
- > Not so much hard to understand but hard to accept / embrace
- ➢ God is your father / still your Father
- Salvation (at least in this text) <u>isn't</u> the issue but sanctification / growth in grace / moving forward is
- > No forgiveness = no forward movement...a dead-end, stuck, stalled, stopped, imprisoned...

## So what do you suggest? Should I root-around in my childhood?

<u>Acts 13:38</u> Be it known unto you therefore, men and brethren, that through <u>this</u> man is preached unto you **the forgiveness of sins:** <u>Acts 13:39</u> And **by him** <u>all</u> that believe are justified from <u>all</u> things, from which ye could not be justified by the law of Moses.

<u>Ephesians 1:7</u> In whom we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of his grace;

<u>Micah 7:18</u> Who is a God like unto thee, that pardoneth iniquity, And passeth by the transgression of the remnant of his heritage? He retaineth not his anger for ever, Because he delighteth in mercy. <u>Micah 7:19</u> He will turn again, he will have compassion upon us; He will subdue our iniquities; And thou wilt cast all their sins into the depths of the sea. <u>Micah 7:20</u> Thou wilt perform the truth to Jacob, and the mercy to Abraham, Which thou hast sworn unto our fathers from the days of old.

#### My suggestion:

- > Drink!
- > Drink deeply!
- Give others a drink as the situation demands!

# 2. An emotional prison

<u>Ephesians 4:31</u> Let <u>all bitterness ( $\Pi \tilde{\alpha} \sigma \alpha \pi \kappa \rho i \alpha$ )</u>, and wrath, and anger, and clamour ( $\kappa \rho \alpha \nu \gamma \eta$ ), and evil speaking, be put away from you, with all malice:

<u>Hebrews 12:15</u> Looking diligently lest any man fail of the grace of God; lest any <u>root of bitterness (ῥίζα</u> <u>πικρίας)</u> springing up trouble you, and thereby many be defiled;

Failure to forgive / an unwillingness to forgive bottles-up emotions of:

- Right & wrong
- > Justice
- > Fairness

The longer these are bottled-up they begin to transform / change into corrosive / harmful / self-destructive emotions...maybe we could call them off-putting emotions.

We find ourselves in:

- A prison
- An emotional prison

- > An emotional prison that we ourselves have built
- > An emotional prison we have willingly entered and can (by God's grace) willingly leave!!!
- > An emotional prison for which we hold the key!

"Not forgiving is like drinking rat poison and then waiting for the rat to die."

# 3. Displaced anger

**Ephesians 4:26 Be ye angry**, and sin **<u>not</u>**: let **<u>not</u>** the sun go down upon your wrath: **<u>Ephesians 4:27</u>** <u>Neither</u> give place to the devil.

Disobedience &/ an unwillingness to forgive bottles-up all those corrosive emotions  $\rightarrow$  particularly anger, and bottled-up anger will <u>not</u> / does <u>not</u> stay bottled-up!

Anger finds a way out.

Anger **always** shows up – although <u>not</u> in **predictable** ways and places! Anger even shows up in ways not predictable to the individual.

<u>Proverbs 14:17</u> He that is soon angry dealeth foolishly: And a man of wicked devices is hated.
<u>Proverbs 21:19</u> It is better to dwell in the wilderness, Than with a contentious and an angry woman.
<u>Proverbs 22:24</u> Make no friendship with an angry man; And with a furious man thou shalt not go: <u>Proverbs 22:25</u> Lest thou learn his ways, And get a snare to thy soul.

**Proverbs 29:22** An angry man stirreth up strife, And a furious man aboundeth in transgression.

## 4. Relational spillover

<u>Hebrews 12:15</u> Looking diligently lest any man fail of the grace of God; lest any root of bitterness springing up trouble you, and thereby many be defiled ( $\mu \alpha \nu \theta \tilde{\omega} \sigma \iota \nu \pi o \lambda \lambda o i$ );

## The ugliest part of disobedience is the out-of-proportion impact on children<sup>+++</sup>.

## What should I do? What should I counsel others to do?

<u>Acts 13:38</u> Be it known unto you therefore, men and brethren, that through <u>this</u> man is preached unto you **the forgiveness of sins:** <u>Acts 13:39</u> And **by him** <u>all</u> that believe are justified from <u>all</u> things, from which ye could not be justified by the law of Moses.

<u>Romans 5:5</u> And hope maketh not ashamed; <u>because</u> the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us.

John 14:27 Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: <u>not</u> as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

<u>Romans 5:20</u> Moreover the law entered, that the offence might abound. **But where sin abounded, grace did much more abound:** 

Start drinking / eating / savoring the:

- > The love of God
- > The forgiveness of God
- The Grace of God
- > The Peace of God

As hurts, wrongdoing, evil, harm...comes up → forgive and then get back to the goodness of God!!!
