#### JESUS AS TEACHER: PAR EXCELLENCE OR SUI GENERIS?

<u>Matthew 7:28</u> And it came to pass, when Jesus had ended these sayings, the people were astonished at his doctrine: <u>Matthew 7:29</u> For he taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes.

### What is Matthew getting at?

## This is not a "how to" text but an "Oh my" text – Who is this Jesus???

<u>Matthew 13:54</u> And when he was come into his own country, he taught them in their synagogue, **insomuch that they were** astonished, and said, Whence hath <u>this</u> man <u>this</u> wisdom, and <u>these</u> mighty works? <u>Matthew 13:55</u> Is not this the carpenter's son? is not his mother called Mary? and his brethren, James, and Joses, and Simon, and Judas? <u>Matthew 13:56</u> And his sisters, are they not all with us? Whence then hath this man all these things? <u>Matthew 13:57</u> And they were offended in him. But Jesus said unto them, A prophet is not without honour, save in his own country, and in his own house.

# Par Excellence or Sui Generis? It is Sui Generis all the way!

## 1. That He taught...& taught deeply and broadly and...!

<u>Matthew 7:28</u> And it came to pass, when Jesus had <u>ended</u> these sayings, the people were astonished at his doctrine: <u>Matthew 7:29</u> For he taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes.

<u>Matthew 11:1</u> And it came to pass, when Jesus had <u>made an end</u> of commanding his twelve disciples, he departed thence to teach and to preach in their cities.

Matthew 13:53 And it came to pass, that when Jesus had finished these parables, he departed thence.

Matthew 19:1 And it came to pass, that when Jesus had finished these sayings, he departed from Galilee, and came into the coasts of Judaea beyond Jordan;

Matthew 26:1 And it came to pass, when Jesus had finished all these sayings, he said unto his disciples,

# 2. What He taught!

We can easily overlook what and how much Jesus taught!

Not all of it was absolutely unique but as a collection – sui generis!

Beatitudes	Salt & light	How to treat your enemies
How to give, pray & fast	Lord's Prayer for His disciples	Money
Worry	The Kingdom now & in the future	The future

## 3. How He taught!

Matthew 7:28 And it came to pass, when Jesus had ended these sayings, the people were astonished at his doctrine: Matthew 7:29 For he taught them as (ὡς ἐξουσίαν ἔχων) one having authority, and not as (οὐχ ὡς) the scribes.

This is the ultimate break with all comparisons:

#### Levels of authority:

# 5. No authority - simply someone's opinion / emotion

# 4. Authority of the Scribes – which was only scribes! Authority comes from the scribes before you that you follow!

<u>Matthew 15:1</u> Then came to Jesus scribes and Pharisees, which were of Jerusalem, saying, <u>Matthew 15:2</u> **Why do thy disciples transgress the tradition of the elders?** for they wash not their hands when they eat bread.

#### 3. Authority of a Pastor / Teacher - "it is written!"

I (or a pastor) have no personal, inherent authority!
God ← Word / Scripture ← Pastor

## 2. Authority of a Prophet &/ an Apostle - "Thus saith the Lord!"

Ultimately the authority is God himself.

#### 1. The Authority of Jesus - "But I say unto you!"

Matthew 5:21 Ye have heard that it was said by them of old time, Thou shalt not kill; and whosoever shall kill shall be in danger of the judgment: Matthew 5:22 But I say unto you, That whosoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment: and whosoever shall say to his brother, Raca, shall be in danger of the council: but whosoever shall say, Thou fool, shall be in danger of hell fire.

<u>Matthew 5:27</u> Ye have heard that it was said by them of old time, Thou shalt not commit adultery: <u>Matthew 5:28</u> <u>But</u> I say unto you, That whosoever looketh on a woman to lust after her hath committed adultery with her already in his heart.

Matthew 5:31 It hath been said, Whosoever shall put away his wife, let him give her a writing of divorcement: Matthew 5:32 But say unto you, That whosoever shall put away his wife, saving for the cause of fornication, causeth her to commit adultery: and whosoever shall marry her that is divorced committeth adultery.

<u>Matthew 5:33</u> Again, ye have heard that it hath been said by them of old time, Thou shalt not forswear thyself, but shalt perform unto the Lord thine oaths: **Matthew 5:34 But** I say unto you, Swear not at all; neither by heaven; for it is God's throne:

Matthew 5:38 Ye have heard that it hath been said, An eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth: Matthew 5:39 But I say unto you, That ye resist not evil: but whosoever shall smite thee on thy right cheek, turn to him the other also.

Matthew 5:43 Ye have heard that it hath been said, Thou shalt love thy neighbour, and hate thine enemy. Matthew 5:44 But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you;

## 4. Who taught!

The teaching of Jesus was never meant to just communicate but to force us to deal with who was teaching! Who is **this** man?
