

6. Read Job | Keep reading Job **with** your questions **and** your lack of understanding.

Past chapter 2, maybe chapter 3, we all start struggling. By chapter 4...the wheels come off.

We will either read Job **with** our questions **and** our lack of understanding → or we will not read Job at all.

Thoughts:

- Read **knowing** you don't understand
- Read **to** understand

- Read knowing it takes serious time to understand

- Read knowing it takes EVERYONE time, effort, prayer, meditation, & consultation to understand.

- Read for **more than** understanding → read for the meaning | Ideas | Wisdom

Job 28:28 And unto man he said, Behold, the fear of the Lord, that is wisdom; **And to depart from evil is understanding.**

Proverbs 1:7 The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge: But fools despise wisdom and instruction.

Proverbs 9:10 The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom: **And the knowledge of the holy is understanding.**

Psalm 111:10 The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom: A good understanding have all they that do his commandments: His praise endureth for ever.

Ecclesiastes 8:12 Though a sinner do evil an hundred times, and his days be prolonged, **yet surely I know that it shall be well with them that fear God, which fear before him:**

Ecclesiastes 12:13 Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: **Fear God**, and **keep** his commandments: for this is the whole duty of man. **Ecclesiastes 12:14** **For God shall bring every work into judgment**, with every secret thing, whether it be good, or whether it be evil.

What does this mean?

Job 32:2 Then was kindled the wrath of Elihu the son of Barachel the Buzite, of the kindred of Ram: against Job was his wrath kindled, because he justified himself rather than God. **Job 32:3** Also against his three friends was his wrath kindled, because they had found no answer, and yet had condemned Job. **Job 32:4** Now Elihu had waited till Job had spoken, because they were elder than he. **Job 32:5** When Elihu saw that there was no answer in the mouth of these three men, then his wrath was kindled.

Job 38:1 Then the LORD answered Job out of the whirlwind, and said,

Job 39:1 Knowest thou the time when the wild goats of the rock bring forth? Or canst thou mark when the hinds do calve?

Job 40:1 Moreover **the LORD** answered Job, and said, **Job 40:2** Shall he that contendeth with the Almighty instruct him? He that reproveth God, let him answer it.

Therefore have I uttered that I understood not; Things too wonderful for me, which I knew not. **Job 42:4** Hear, I beseech thee, and I will speak: I will demand of thee, and declare thou unto me. **Job 42:5** I have heard of thee by the hearing of the ear: But now mine eye seeth thee. **Job 42:6** Wherefore I abhor myself, and repent In dust and ashes.

Job 42:7 And it was so, that **after the LORD had spoken these words unto Job, the LORD said to Eliphaz the Temanite, My wrath is kindled against thee, and against thy two friends: for ye have not spoken of me the thing that is right, as my servant Job hath. Job 42:8** Therefore take unto you now seven bullocks and seven rams, and go to **my servant Job**, and offer up for yourselves a burnt offering; and **my servant Job** shall pray for you: for him will I accept: lest I deal with you after your folly, in that ye have not spoken of me the thing which is right, like **my servant Job**.
