VIEWPOINTS⁺ **MT. 19:3-12**

Marriage, divorce, & remarriage is a constant source of confusion around the world.

USA experience: We have a "broadly Christian" & "broadly based on Scripture" background.

- > No bigamy
- ➤ No polygamy → especially true when Utah & Mormons joined the union!
- > Divorce...? Well, yes
- > Divorce highly limited to 2 causes that had to either proven or conceded in a court of law
- > This was true up till the late 1960s & early 1970s
- > Then "no fault" divorce was introduced
- > The idea was to protect the women

1. No divorce, no remarriage

- ➤ God's original design / intent!
- "at the beginning"

<u>Matthew 19:3</u> The Pharisees also came unto him, tempting him, and saying unto him, **Is it lawful for a man to put away** his wife **for every cause?**

From an initial reading we know:

- > This was a trap for Jesus!
- > This is also a trap for us
- > The question is...ludicrous!
- > The question is in some ways quite modern!

<u>Matthew 19:4</u> And he answered and said unto them, **Have ye not read, that he which made them at the beginning made them male and female, <u>Matthew 19:5</u> <u>And said, For</u> this cause shall a man leave father and mother, and shall cleave to his wife: and they twain shall be one flesh? <u>Matthew 19:6</u> <u>Wherefore</u> they are no more twain, but one flesh. What therefore God hath joined together, let not man put asunder.**

<u>Matthew 19:7</u> They say unto him, <u>Why</u> did Moses then command to give a writing of divorcement, and to put her away?

Romans 4:3 For what saith the scripture? Abraham believed God, and it was counted unto him for righteousness.

Jesus' answer:

- ➤ What does Scripture say?
- ➤ Have you read it?
- > Start at the beginning -> God's original design / intent
- > Start with marriage, family, and NOT divorce!
- **➤** God created us male & female
- ➤ God created us for marriage (the norm, not the absolute)

F. D. Brunner:

"If God had supremely intended solitary life, God would have created humans one by one; if God had intended polygamous life, God would have created one man and several women; if God had intended homosexual life, God would have made two men or two women; but that God intended monogamous heterosexual life was shown by God's creation of one man and one woman."

- > One man, one woman for life was & is God' design & intent
- > God Himself **designed** the family unit | the concept of the family
- > God's original design is the starting point of all discussions
- ➤ Marriage was God's original design divorce wasn't!!!

2. Divorce, no remarriage

- > The fallback position
- "and shall marry another"

<u>Matthew 19:9</u> And I say unto you, Whosoever shall put away his wife, except it be for fornication, **and shall marry another**, committeth adultery: and whoso marrieth her which is put away doth commit adultery.

Mark 10:10 And in the house his disciples asked him again of the same matter. Mark 10:11 And he saith unto them, Whosoever shall put away his wife, and marry another, committeth adultery against her. Mark 10:12 And if a woman shall put away her husband, and be married to another, she committeth adultery.

<u>Luke 16:18</u> Whosoever putteth away his wife, **and marrieth another**, committeth adultery: and whosoever marrieth her that is put away from her husband committeth adultery.

This viewpoint:

- > Is based on the premise that people will remarry
- ➤ Divorce → remarriage (and it seems the Bible assumes this also)
- > This view finds remarriage to be the problem

[Malachi 2:16 For the LORD, the God of Israel, saith that he hateth putting away: For one covereth violence with his garment, saith the LORD of hosts: Therefore take heed to your spirit, that ye deal not treacherously.]

> Paul seems to agree with this position

<u>1 Corinthians 7:10</u> And unto the married I command, yet <u>not</u> I, <u>but</u> the Lord, Let <u>not</u> the wife depart from her husband: <u>1 Corinthians 7:11</u> <u>But and if</u> she depart, let her remain **unmarried**, or be reconciled to her husband: and let not the husband put away his wife.

On a practical and personal level, I find this position helpful:

Divorce is \underline{not} the first option

Divorce is permissible

Divorce & then stay single

Divorce & renconcile if possible

Divorce and stay single until... | for...a long time!
