THE CENTER OF THE JOURNEY! PSALM 130

What is the center / centerpiece / apex / high point of the journey? This Pilgrim Psalm answers that question! **THE LORD:**

Actually named:

130:1 130:2 130:3 130:5 130:6

130:7

Named via pronouns:

130:1 Thee 130:2 Thine 130:3 Thou 130:4 Thee, Thou 130:5 His 130:7 Him 130:8 He

So, what do we find?

1. Crying to the Lord!

<u>Psalm 130:1</u> Out of the depths have I cried unto thee, O LORD. **<u>Psalm 130:2</u>** Lord, <u>hear</u> my voice: Let thine ears <u>be attentive</u> to the voice of my supplications.

The initial verses focus on the common, human condition:

- > In the depths
- > In great peril &/ in great need
- > Only <u>one</u> place to turn
- Crying...crying out!

The simplicity of faith...

There is some value in learning more technical & sophisticated language...but...

- Asking the Lord to hear
- > Asking the Lord to hear & be attentive

Did you hear me?

Yes, I heard you but I wasn't listening!

2. Receiving from the Lord!

Psalm 130:3 If thou, LORD, shouldest mark iniquities, O Lord, who shall stand? **Psalm 130:4** But there is forgiveness with thee, That thou mayest be feared.

We often encounter / run into 2 roadblocks at this point:

➢ But I'm saved!!!

OK, but we aren't just talking about

John 10:27 My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me: <u>Psalm 128:1</u> Blessed is every one that <u>feareth</u> the LORD; That <u>walketh</u> in his ways.

But I have surrendered!!!

No matter what I preached I received a bewildered look...huh? I don't understand???

This is speaking to believers It's <u>not</u> about being / getting saved OR staying saved! It's about **following** the Lord on the Journey!

Thoughts:

➤ We sin!

The specific words are important but not the issue!

- > What is God keeps a record?
- ➢ He knows!

He has no need for records!

➢ We could not

<u>Psalm 1:5</u> Therefore the ungodly shall <u>not</u> stand in the judgment, Nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous. <u>Psalm 5:5</u> The foolish shall <u>not</u> stand in thy sight: Thou hatest all workers of iniquity.

Psalm 24:3 Who shall ascend into the hill of the LORD? Or who shall stand in his holy place?

<u>1 Samuel 6:20</u> And the men of Beth-shemesh said, **Who is able to stand before this holy LORD God?** and to whom shall he go up from us?

<u>1 Kings 8:10</u> And it came to pass, when the priests were come out of the holy place, that the cloud filled the house of the LORD,

<u>1 Kings 8:11</u> So that the priests could <u>not</u> stand to minister because of the cloud: for the glory of the LORD had filled the house of the LORD.

Psalm 76:7 Thou, even thou, art to be feared: And who may stand in thy sight when once thou art angry?

> We receive forgiveness ...once & for all...<u>and</u> also again & again!

Ephesians 1:7 In whom we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of his grace;

<u>1 John 1:9</u> If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

3. Waiting for the Lord!

Psalm 130:5 I wait for the LORD, my soul doth wait, And in his word do I hope.

Psalm 130:6 My soul waiteth for the Lord More than they that watch for the morning: I say, more than they that watch for the morning.

- ➤ I wait
- > For the Lord
- My soul = me + intensity
- > In His Word
- > More than...
- And I don't like to wait!!!

4. Advocating <u>about</u> (everything) the Lord!

Advocating \rightarrow recommending, commending...

<u>Psalm 130:7</u> Let Israel hope in the LORD: For <u>with</u> (בְּי־<u>עָם</u>־יְהָוָה הַחֶּסָד) the LORD there is mercy, And <u>with him</u> (הָרְבָה עַמוֹ פָדָוֹת) is plenteous redemption.

Psalm 130:8 And he shall redeem Israel From all his iniquities.

Psalm 130:4 But there is forgiveness with thee (בייעמה הסליחה), That thou mayest be feared.

3 withs:

1. With Him is forgiveness

- 2. With Him is mercy
- 3. With Him is plenteous (more than enough) redemption

And He shall redeem
