HUMILITY FOR THE JOURNEY PSALM 131

<u>Romans 12:3</u> For I say, through the grace given unto me, to every man that is among you, <u>**not**</u> to think of himself more highly than he ought to think; <u>**but**</u> to think soberly, **according as** God hath dealt to every man the measure of faith. <u>**Romans 12:4**</u> For as we have many members in one body, and all members have not the same office: <u>**Romans 12:5**</u> So we, being many, are one body in Christ, and every one members one of another.

<u>Romans 12:10</u> Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another;

<u>Romans 12:16</u> Be of the same mind one toward another. Mind not high things, but condescend to men of low estate. Be not wise in your own conceits.

Ephesians 4:2 With all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another in love;

<u>Philippians 2:2</u> Fulfil ye my joy, that ye be likeminded, having the same love, being of one accord, of one mind. <u>Philippians 2:3</u> Let <u>nothing</u> be done through strife or vainglory; <u>but</u> in lowliness of mind let each esteem other better than themselves. <u>Philippians 2:4</u> Look <u>not</u> every man on his own things, <u>but</u> every man also on the things of others. <u>Philippians 2:5</u> Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus:

<u>Colossians 3:12</u> Put on therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, **bowels of mercies, kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, longsuffering;**

Proverbs 3:7 Be not wise in thine own eyes (בְּעֵינֶגֶר): Fear the LORD, and depart from evil.

<u>Proverbs 26:12</u> Seest thou a man wise in his own conceit (בְּעֵיְגָין)? There is more hope of a fool than of him.

Isaiah 5:21 Woe unto them that are wise in their own eyes (בְּעֵינֵיהָם), And prudent in their own sight!

Humility for the Journey helps us:

- Will cause you to think <u>about</u> yourself less
- > Will cause you to <u>appreciate</u> others more ...maybe, much more
- > Will allow you to like others more
- Will make you better company
- > Will make it much easier to work with a team

1. Lord, I'm not above anyone else!

<u>Psalm 131:1</u> LORD, My heart is <u>not</u> haughty, nor mine eyes lofty: Neither do I exercise myself in great matters, or in things too high for me.

Note: heart → eyes → soul (later) → life itself! Pride & arrogance impacts us <u>all</u> AND <u>all</u> parts of us!

It certainly has a start in early childhood with competition. It continues for us **until / unless** we realize <u>not</u> everything is about competition

2. Lord, I don't see myself above anyone else!

<u>Psalm 131:1</u> LORD, My heart is not haughty, <u>nor</u> mine eyes lofty: Neither do I exercise myself in great matters, or in things too high for me.

How we see ourselves How we see others Pride & arrogance **leaks out** of our eyes!

<u>Proverbs 6:16</u> These six things doth the LORD hate: Yea, seven are an abomination unto him:
<u>Proverbs 6:17</u> A proud look, a lying tongue, And hands that shed innocent blood,
<u>Proverbs 6:18</u> An heart that deviseth wicked imaginations, Feet that be swift in running to mischief, <u>Proverbs 6:19</u> A false witness that speaketh lies, And he that soweth discord among brethren.

3. Lord, some things are above me!

<u>Psalm 131:1</u> LORD, My heart is not haughty, nor mine eyes lofty: <u>Neither</u> do I exercise myself in great matters, or in things too high for me.

A book I read made this recommendation: do something that you have no experience with

When you are feeling a little full of yourself...get out of your comfort zone.

This makes it **much easier** to appreciate the contributions of others.

They say that "confession is good for the soul!"

I agree that we need to confess (at least to the Lord):

That we sin That we are sinners That we make mistakes That we don't know everything That we can't do everything

4. Lord, I <u>don't</u> act like I'm above anyone else!

<u>Psalm 131:2</u> Surely I have <u>behaved</u> and <u>quieted</u> myself (גְלְשָׁי), As a child that is weaned of his mother: My soul (נְלָשִׁי) is **even as** a weaned child.

5. Lord, you <u>are</u> above everyone else!

Psalm 131:3 Let Israel hope in the LORD From henceforth and for ever.

<u>Psalm 130:7</u> Let Israel hope in the LORD: For with the LORD there is mercy, And with him is plenteous redemption.

It's hard to trust & hope in the Lord when you are trusting in yourself!
