THE CHURCH OF THE OPEN DOOR! REV. 3:7-8; ISA. 22:22

Revelation 3:7 And to the angel of the church in Philadelphia write; These things saith he that is holy, he that is true, he that hath the key of David (ὁ ἔχων τὴν κλεῖν τοῦ Δανίδ), he that openeth (ὁ ἀνοίγων), and no man shutteth (οὐδεὶς κλείσει); and shutteth (κλείων), and no man openeth (οὐδεὶς ἀνοίζει);

Revelation 3:8 I know thy works: behold, I have set before thee <u>an open door (θύραν ἀνεωγμένην)</u>, and **no man can shut (οὐδεὶς δύναται κλεῖσαι αὐτήν) it**: for thou hast a little strength, and hast kept my word, and hast not denied my name.

I first came to this concept **outside** of Scripture...as part of Christian language!

- ➤ God opened a door
- > God closed a door (much less frequent)
- ➤ God closed a door but opened a window!!!

What does Scripture say / teach about open doors?

1. God opens doors!

<u>Revelation 3:7</u> And to the angel of the church in Philadelphia write; These things saith he that is holy, he that is true, he that hath the key of David, **he that openeth**, and no man shutteth; and shutteth, and no man openeth; <u>Revelation 3:8</u> I know thy works: **behold**, I have set before thee an open door, and no man can shut it: for thou hast a little strength, and hast kept my word, and hast not denied my name.

<u>Isaiah 22:22</u> And the key of the house of David will I lay upon his shoulder; **So he shall open,** and none shall shut; And he shall shut, and none shall open.

Obviously this one idea implies & even requires other ideas:

- > The doors are closed
- > The doors are <u>not</u> open
- > The doors <u>don't</u> open themselves
- > God has to open the doors!
- > Doors are closed until &/ unless God opens them = unlocks

2. God more than opens doors!

<u>Revelation 3:7</u> And to the angel of the church in Philadelphia write; These things saith he that is holy, he that is true, he that hath the key of David, **he that openeth**, <u>and</u> **no man shutteth**; and shutteth, and no man openeth; <u>Revelation 3:8</u> I know thy works: behold, I have set before thee an open door, <u>and</u> no man can shut it: for thou hast a little strength, and hast kept my word, and hast not denied my name.

<u>Isaiah 22:22</u> And the key of the house of David will I lay upon his shoulder; **So he shall open**, <u>and</u> **none shall shut**; And he shall shut, and none shall open.

Worry is the natural state of all humans – including Christians.

Some more

Some less

Some always

Some rarely

But all worry!

Psalm 103:19 The LORD hath prepared his throne in the heavens; And his kingdom ruleth over all.

3. God also closes doors!

<u>Revelation 3:7</u> And to the angel of the church in Philadelphia write; These things saith he that is holy, he that is true, he that hath the key of David, he that openeth, and no man shutteth; and shutteth, and no man openeth;

<u>Isaiah 22:22</u> And the key of the house of David will I lay upon his shoulder; So he shall open, and none shall shut; **And he shall shut, and none shall open.**

Is this just me?

God opens a door → I'm not interested

God closes a door → that's the only door I'm interested in

4. God primarily opens doors for the gospel | gospel ministry!

Revelation 3:7 And to the angel of the church in Philadelphia write; These things saith he that is holy, he that is true, he that hath the key of David, he that openeth, and no man shutteth; and shutteth, and no man openeth; Revelation 3:8 I know thy works: behold, I have set before thee an open door, and no man can shut it: for thou hast a little strength, and hast kept my word, and hast not denied my name.

Door $(\theta \acute{\nu} \rho \alpha)$ when used metaphorically / symbolically relates primarily to the gospel | gospel ministry

<u>John 10:7</u> Then said Jesus unto them again, Verily, I say unto you, **I am the door of the sheep.**<u>John 10:9</u> **I am the door**: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out, and find pasture.

Acts 14:27 And when they were come, and had gathered the church together, they rehearsed all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith unto the Gentiles.

<u>2 Corinthians 2:12</u> Furthermore, when I came to Troas to preach Christ's gospel, and a door was opened unto me of the Lord.

<u>Colossians 4:3</u> Withal praying also for us, that God would open unto us a door of utterance, to speak the mystery of Christ, for which I am also in bonds:

<u>All</u> of the metaphorical | symbolic, Biblical references:

- > Are about Christ
- > Are about the gospel
- > Are about the ministry of the gospel
- > Are about God opening a door of faith

Acts 14:27 And when they were come, and had gathered the church together, they rehearsed all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith unto the Gentiles.

Acts 16:14 And a certain woman named Lydia, a seller of purple, of the city of Thyatira, which worshipped God, heard us: whose heart the Lord opened, that she attended unto the things which were spoken of Paul.

- > Are about God opening that kind of door
- > Are about praying that God would open a door!
- ➤ NOT about | NOT primarily about God opening a door for me to...

5. God opens doors of opportunity AND opposition!

1 Corinthians 16:9 For a great door and effectual is opened unto me, and there are many adversaries.

Acts 16:9 And a vision appeared to Paul in the night; There stood a man of Macedonia, and prayed him, saying, Come over into Macedonia, and help us. Acts 16:10 And after he had seen the vision, immediately we endeavoured to go into Macedonia, assuredly gathering that the Lord had called us for to preach the gospel unto them.

Acts 16:14 And a certain woman named Lydia, a seller of purple, of the city of Thyatira, which worshipped God, heard us: whose heart the Lord opened, that she attended unto the things which were spoken of Paul.

Acts 16:25 And at midnight Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God: and the prisoners heard them.
