That in the ages to come he might shew the exceeding riches of his grace in his kindness toward us through

Christ Jesus. <u>Ephesians 2:8 For</u> by grace are ye saved through faith; and that <u>not</u> of yourselves: it is the gift of God: <u>Ephesians 2:9 Not</u> of works, lest any man should boast.

Roman Catholicism understands and takes more seriously than many Baptist "Original Sin" Baptists often give children a free pass.

BIBLICAL POINTERS

The Bible really doesn't discuss this much at all...the best we can do is give pointers:

A. A historical argument

<u>Deuteronomy 1:37</u> Also the LORD was angry with me for your sakes, saying, Thou also shalt <u>not</u> go in thither. <u>Deuteronomy 1:38</u> <u>But</u> Joshua the son of Nun, which standeth before thee, he shall go in thither: encourage him: for he shall cause Israel to inherit it. <u>Deuteronomy 1:39</u> <u>Moreover your little ones, which ye said should be a prey, and your children, which in that day had no knowledge between good and evil, they <u>shall</u> go in thither, and unto them will I give it, and they shall possess it. <u>Deuteronomy 1:40</u> <u>But</u> as for you, turn you, and take your journey into the wilderness by the way of the Red sea.</u>

<u>Isaiah 7:15</u> Butter and honey shall he eat, That he may know to refuse the evil, and choose the good. <u>Isaiah</u> <u>7:16</u> For before the child shall know to refuse the evil, and choose the good, The land that thou abhorrest shall be forsaken of both her kings.

Jonah 4:11 And should not I spare Nineveh, that great city, wherein are more than sixscore thousand persons that cannot discern between their right hand and their left hand; and also much cattle?

This is generally called: The Age of Accountability
This leaves us with 3 conditions of children: safe \rightarrow lost \rightarrow saved

What's the weakness of this? What age??

B. A Biblical | textual argument

Romans 15:4 For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning, **that** we through patience and comfort of the scriptures **might have hope**.

A. Before loss → hope in God!

- <u>2 Samuel 12:22</u> And he said, <u>While</u> the child was yet alive, I fasted and wept: for I said, **Who can tell** whether **GOD** will be gracious to me, that the child may live?

I call this the "uncertainty principle!"

<u>Joel 2:13</u> And rend your heart, and not your garments, And turn unto the LORD your God: For he is gracious and merciful, Slow to anger, and of great kindness, And repenteth him of the evil. <u>Joel 2:14</u> **Who knoweth** if he will return and repent, And leave a blessing behind him; Even a meat offering and a drink offering unto the LORD your God?

Amos 5:15 Hate the evil, and love the good, and establish judgment in the gate: It may be that the LORD God of hosts will be gracious unto the remnant of Joseph.

<u>Jonah 1:6</u> So the shipmaster came to him, and said unto him, What meanest thou, O sleeper? arise, call upon thy God, **if so be that God will think upon us, that we perish not.**

<u>Jonah 3:9</u> Who can tell if God will turn and repent, and turn away from his fierce anger, that we perish not? <u>Jonah 3:10</u> And God saw their works, that they turned from their evil way; and God repented of the evil, that he had said that he would do unto them; and he did it not.

<u>Zephaniah 2:3</u> Seek ye the LORD, all ye meek of the earth, Which have wrought his judgment; Seek righteousness, seek meekness: **It may be ye shall be hid in the day of the LORD's anger.**

<u>1 Samuel 14:6</u> And Jonathan said to the young man that bare his armour, Come, and let us go over unto the garrison of these uncircumcised: it may be that the LORD will work for us: for there is no restraint to the

LORD to save by many or by few. <u>1 Samuel 14:7</u> And his armourbearer said unto him, Do all that is in thine heart: turn thee; behold, I am with thee according to thy heart.

<u>2 Samuel 16:11</u> And David said to Abishai, and to all his servants, Behold, my son, which came forth of my bowels, seeketh my life: how much more now may this Benjamite do it? let him alone, and let him curse; for the LORD hath bidden him. <u>2 Samuel 16:12</u> It may be that the LORD will look on mine affliction, and that the LORD will requite me good for his cursing this day.

<u>2 Kings 19:4</u> It may be the LORD thy God will hear all the words of Rab-shakeh, whom the king of Assyria his master hath sent to reproach the living God; and will reprove the words which the LORD thy God hath heard: wherefore lift up thy prayer for the remnant that are left.

B. During loss \rightarrow hope in God!

- <u>2 Samuel 12:19</u> But when David saw that his servants whispered, David perceived that the child was dead: therefore David said unto his servants, Is the child dead? And they said, <u>He is dead.</u>
- <u>2 Samuel 12:20 Then</u> David **arose** from the earth, and **washed**, and **anointed** himself, and **changed** his apparel, and came into the house of the LORD, and **worshipped**: then he came to his own house; and when he required, they set bread before him, **and he did eat.**
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The God of hope gives hope:

Not just the specific words

But more so the actions of David

Which demonstrate David had found hope in God and the future.

And was able to share that hope with Bathsheba.

NT believers have even more specific hope than that...

<u>Philippians 1:20</u> According to my earnest expectation and my hope, that in nothing I shall be ashamed, but that with all boldness, as always, so now also Christ shall be magnified in my body, whether it be by life, or by death. <u>Philippians 1:21</u> For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain. <u>Philippians 1:22</u> But if I live in the flesh, this is the fruit of my labour: yet what I shall choose I wot not. <u>Philippians 1:23</u> For I am in a strait betwixt two, having a desire to depart, and to be with Christ; which is far better: <u>Philippians 1:24</u> Nevertheless to abide in the flesh is more needful for you.

<u>2 Corinthians 5:6</u> Therefore we are always confident, knowing that, whilst we are at home in the body, we are absent from the Lord: <u>2 Corinthians 5:7</u> (For we walk by faith, not by sight:) <u>2 Corinthians 5:8</u> We are confident, I say, and willing rather to be absent from the body, and to be present with the Lord.

C. After loss → hope in God!

<u>2 Samuel 12:1</u> And <u>the LORD</u> sent Nathan unto David. And he came unto him, and said unto him, There were two men in one city; the one rich, and the other poor.

<u>2 Samuel 12:24</u> And David comforted Bath-sheba his wife, and went in unto her, and lay with her: and she bare a son, and he called his name Solomon: and the LORD loved him.

<u>2 Samuel 12:25</u> And <u>he</u> sent by the hand of Nathan the prophet; and <u>he</u> called his name **Jedidiah**, because of the LORD.

3. A theological premise / argument

Genesis 18:25 That be far from thee to do after this manner, to slay the righteous with the wicked: and that the righteous should be as the wicked, that be far from thee: Shall not the Judge of all the earth do right?

<u>Deuteronomy 32:4</u> He is the Rock, his work is perfect: For all his ways are judgment: A God of truth and without iniquity, Just and right is he.

Job 34:12 Yea, surely God will not do wickedly, Neither will the Almighty pervert judgment.

<u>Psalm 58:11</u> So that a man shall say, <u>Verily</u> there is a reward for the righteous: <u>Verily</u> he is a God that judgeth in the earth.
