### The Paradox of the Cross

1 Corinthians 1:17-23

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- 17 For Christ sent me not to baptize, but to preach the gospel: not with wisdom of words, lest the cross of Christ should be made of none effect.
- **18** For the preaching of the cross is to them that perish foolishness; but unto us which are saved it is the power of God.
- 19 For it is written, I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and will bring to nothing the understanding of the prudent.
- **20** Where *is* the wise? where *is* the scribe? where *is* the disputer of this world? hath not God made foolish the wisdom of this world?
- 21 For after that in the wisdom of God the world by wisdom knew not God, it pleased God by the foolishness of preaching to save them that believe.
- 22 For the Jews require a sign, and the Greeks seek after wisdom:
- 23 But we preach Christ crucified, unto the Jews a stumblingblock, and unto the Greeks foolishness;

#### The Cross is a Paradox

- It is both a symbol of suffering and of victory.
- It represents judgment and mercy, death and life, shame and glory...
- ....Sin and righteousness
- ....Condemnation and justification

God sent Paul to preach Christ, and Him crucified.

1 Corinthians 2:2 <sup>2</sup> For I determined not to know any thing among you, save Jesus Christ, and him crucified.

Galatians 6:14 <sup>14</sup> But God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified unto me, and I unto the world.

How should we keep the biblical message of the cross when we witness or preach and teach the truth of the gospel?

1 Corinthians 1:17 <sup>17</sup> For Christ sent me not to baptize, but to preach the gospel: not with wisdom of words, lest the cross of Christ should be made of none effect.

1. Do Not Attempt to Remove the Offense of the Cross

So we may be tempted to remove the sting of its message:

1 Corinthians 15:55–56 <sup>55</sup> O death, where *is* thy sting? O grave, where *is* thy victory? <sup>56</sup> The sting of death *is* sin; and the strength of sin *is* the law.

## Paul's evaluation of himself and his salvation experience is telling:

Philippians 3:4–8 <sup>4</sup> Though I might also have confidence in the flesh. If any other man thinketh that he hath whereof he might trust in the flesh, I more: 5 Circumcised the eighth day, of the stock of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, an Hebrew of the Hebrews; as touching the law, a Pharisee; 6 Concerning zeal, persecuting the church; touching the righteousness which is in the law, blameless. 7 But what things were gain to me, those I counted loss for Christ. 8 Yea doubtless, and I count all things but loss for the excellency of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord: for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and do count them but dung, that I may win Christ,

#### And then he also wrote:

1 Timothy 1:15 <sup>15</sup> This *is* a faithful saying, and worthy of all acceptation, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners; of whom I am chief.

But the chief of all sinners was then transformed into a servant of Jesus Christ.

Romans 1:1 <sup>1</sup> Paul, a servant of Jesus Christ, called to be an apostle, separated unto the gospel of God,

Romans 6:16 <sup>16</sup> Know ye not, that to whom ye yield yourselves servants to obey, his servants ye are to whom ye obey; whether of sin unto death, or of obedience unto righteousness?

- 1 Corinthians 1:18 <sup>18</sup> For the preaching of the cross is to them that perish foolishness; but unto us which are saved it is the power of God.
- 1 Corinthians 1:19 <sup>19</sup> For it is written, I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and will bring to nothing the understanding of the prudent.
- 1 Corinthians 1:22–23 <sup>22</sup> For the Jews require a sign, and the Greeks seek after wisdom: <sup>23</sup> But we preach Christ crucified, unto the Jews a stumblingblock, and unto the Greeks foolishness;

# 2. Do Not be Surprised by the Response of Unbelievers

It is God the Holy Spirit that works in the hearts of unbelievers.

- God saves, not you or me.
- Salvation is of the Lord

1 Corinthians 2:14 <sup>14</sup> But the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know *them*, because they are spiritually discerned.

This conflict of wisdom is even more profound in the responses to its message

Their responses demonstrate the diametrically opposing worldviews.

#### 3 responses:

- It is foolishness some will laugh at you like you still believe in Santa Claus
- It is a stumbling block others find it too easy and it cannot be that simple
- It is the good news to those who believe the wisdom and power of God to experience His mercy and grace!

#### Richard Dawkins (British Evolutionary Biologist)

He asked Christians: "Who created God?"

He believes the universe is all there is and it created us in the process of evolution.

But he has *not* answered the same question asked of him: "Who created your creator?"

The fact: Something does not come from nothing!

The implication: Is the universe then "eternal"?

If his answer is yes, then he would confirm that he believes in an uncreated eternal creator just as Christians believe in eternal Creator – God.

#### **Stephen Hawking** (Theoretical Physicists)

In *The Grand Design*, he declares "Philosophy is dead"—ironically, in a book that the main topic is the philosophy of science!

#### Martin Rees (British Astronomer)

Lord Rees on Hawking's more recent comments about there being no need for God in order to explain creation said, "Stephen Hawking is a remarkable person whom I've known for 40 years and for that reason any oracular statement he makes gets exaggerated publicity. I know Stephen Hawking well enough to know that he has read very little philosophy and even less theology, so I don't think we should attach any weight to his views on this topic," he said.

Richard Feynman (Nobel prize-winning Physicist) Even brilliant scientists can get things badly wrong. He said that outside his or her field, the scientist is just as dumb as the next guy. 1 Corinthians 1:20 <sup>20</sup> Where *is* the wise? where *is* the scribe? where *is* the disputer of this world? hath not God made foolish the wisdom of this world?

1 Corinthians 1:21 <sup>21</sup> For after that in the wisdom of God the world by wisdom knew not God, it pleased God by the foolishness of preaching to save them that believe.

# 3. Do Not Claim to Have All the Answers to Hard Questions

Proverbs 3:7 <sup>7</sup> Be not wise in thine own eyes: Fear the Lord, and depart from evil.

## For every hard/complex question, there is always a simple wrong answer!

<u>Isaiah 55:8–9</u> <sup>8</sup> For my thoughts *are* not your thoughts, Neither *are* your ways my ways, saith the Lord. <sup>9</sup> For *as* the heavens are higher than the earth, So are my ways higher than your ways, And my thoughts than your thoughts.

#### The Scopes "Monkey" Trial, July 10-21, 1925

- Should evolution be taught in our schools?
- Darwinism "On the Origin of the Species" (1859)
- Genesis creation literal 6 days or an allegory?
- The intellectual climate of the 20<sup>th</sup> century shattered the harmony between science and Scripture
- The "Theistic Evolution" compromise (antisupernaturalistic)
- The wisdom of this world thought they discovered the middle ground which many Christians bought into

**Dr. Henry Morris** (Hydraulic Engineer) (The Genesis Flood) Creation Research Society (1963)

- Influential in the creation-science movement with the purpose of restoring the harmony of science and Scripture
- True science can and will confirm Christian revelation
- The Scripture contains true scientifically accurate facts
- This resulted in the fact that there are an unusual number of engineers in the creation-science movement (ca. 1991)

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4. Do Not Resort to Craftiness to Adorn Its Message

The good news is truly good because the bad news is truly bad.

Romans 1:16 <sup>16</sup> For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek.
