### The story of Judah:

### 1. Judah was born into a **problematic** family!

Genesis 29:24 And Laban gave unto his daughter Leah Zilpah his maid for an handmaid. Genesis 29:28 And Jacob did so, and fulfilled her week: and he gave him Rachel his daughter to wife also. Genesis 29:29 And Laban gave to Rachel his daughter Bilhah his handmaid to be her maid. Genesis 29:30 And he went in also unto Rachel, and he loved also Rachel more than Leah, and served with him yet seven other years. Genesis 29:31 And when the Lord saw that Leah was hated, he opened her womb: but Rachel was barren. Genesis 29:32 And Leah conceived, and bare a son, and she called his name Reuben: for she said, Surely the Lord hath looked upon my affliction; now therefore my husband will love me. Genesis 29:33 And she conceived again, and bare a son; and said, Because the Lord hath heard that I was hated, he hath therefore given me this son also: and she called his name Simeon. Genesis 29:34 And she conceived again, and bare a son; and said, Now this time will my husband be joined unto me, because I have born him three sons: therefore was his name called Levi. Genesis 29:35 And she conceived again, and bare a son: and she said, Now will I praise the LORD: therefore she called his name Judah; and left bearing.

### **Thoughts:**

- We are all born into a family
- > A REAL family with weaknesses, gaps, problems...
- Growing up is getting real with your real family!
- Maturity is <u>not</u> bringing into your family the previous generation's baggage
- > & Yes, some families are much worse than others
- > Perfection is not the goal but growth & health is!

## 2. Judah was part of the problem!

Genesis 37:3 Now Israel loved Joseph more than all his children, because he was the son of his old age: and he made him a coat of many colours. Genesis 37:4 And when his brethren saw that their father loved him more than all his brethren, they hated him, and could not speak peaceably unto him. Genesis 37:5 And Joseph dreamed a dream, and he told it his brethren: and they hated him yet the more.

Genesis 37:11 And his brethren envied him; but his father observed the saying.

<u>Genesis 37:18</u> And when they saw him afar off, even before he came near unto them, they conspired against him to slay him. <u>Genesis 37:19</u> And they said one to another, **Behold, this dreamer cometh.** <u>Genesis 37:20</u> Come now therefore, and let us slay him, and cast him into some pit, and we will say, Some evil beast hath devoured him: and we shall see what will become of his dreams.

Genesis 37:21 And Reuben heard it, and he delivered him out of their hands; and said, Let us not kill him. Genesis 37:22 And Reuben said unto them, Shed no blood, but cast him into this pit that is in the wilderness, and lay no hand upon him; that he might rid him out of their hands, to deliver him to his father again.

Genesis 37:26 And Judah said unto his brethren, What profit is it if we slay our brother, and conceal his blood? Genesis 37:27 Come, and let us sell him to the Ishmeelites, and let not our hand be upon him; for he is our brother and our flesh. And his brethren were content.

# The apple doesn't fall / roll far from the tree!!! **Unless it does**!!!

<u>1 Corinthians 15:10</u> But by the grace of God I am what I am: and his grace which was bestowed upon me was not in vain; but I laboured more abundantly than they all: yet not I, but the grace of God which was with me. <u>Philippians 4:13</u> I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me.

## 3. Judah had his own deep problems!

<u>Genesis 38:1</u> And it came to pass at that time, that Judah went down from his brethren, and turned in to a certain Adullamite, whose name was Hirah. <u>Genesis 38:2</u> And Judah saw there a daughter of a certain Canaanite, whose name was Shuah; and he took her, and went in unto her.

Genesis 38:6 And Judah took a wife for Er his firstborn, whose name was Tamar.

Genesis 38:15 When Judah saw her, he thought her to be an harlot (?); because she had covered her face. Genesis 38:16 And he turned unto her by the way, and said, Go to, I pray thee, let me come in unto thee; (for he knew not that she was his daughter in law.) And she said, What will thou give me, that thou mayest come in unto me? Genesis 38:17 And he said, I will send thee a kid from the flock. And she said, Will thou give me a pledge, till thou send it? Genesis 38:18 And he said, What pledge shall I give thee? And she said, Thy signet, and thy bracelets, and thy staff that is in thine hand. And he gave it her, and came in unto her, and she conceived by him. Genesis 38:19 And she arose, and went away, and laid by her vail from her, and put on the garments of her widowhood.

Genesis 38:20 And Judah sent the kid by the hand of his friend the Adullamite, to receive his pledge from the woman's hand: but he found her not. Genesis 38:21 Then he asked the men of that place, saying, Where is the harlot (קַרְיֵבְיִבְּה), that was openly by the way side? And they said, There was no harlot (קַרְבִיבְיִר) in this place. Genesis 38:22 And he returned to Judah, and said, I cannot find her; and also the men of the place said, that there was no harlot (קַרְבִיבְיִר) in this place. Genesis 38:23 And Judah said, Let her take it to her, lest we be shamed: behold, I sent this kid, and thou hast not found her.

Genesis 38:24 And it came to pass about three months after, that it was told Judah, saying, Tamar thy daughter in law hath played the harlot (קֹנְנוֹנְיֵלֵה); and also, behold, she is with child by whoredom (קֹנְנוֹנְיֵלֵה). And Judah said, Bring her forth, and let her be burnt. Genesis 38:25 When she was brought forth, she sent to her father in law, saying, By the man, whose these are, am I with child: and she said, Discern, I pray thee, whose are these, the signet, and bracelets, and staff. Genesis 38:26 And Judah acknowledged them, and said, She hath been more righteous than I; because that I gave her not to Shelah my son. And he knew her again no more.

## 4. Judah now deals with the problem – in a **Christlike** manner!

Genesis 44:11 Then they speedily took down every man his sack to the ground, and opened every man his sack. Genesis 44:12 And he searched, and began at the eldest, and left at the youngest: and the cup was found in Benjamin's sack. Genesis 44:13 Then they rent their clothes, and laded every man his ass, and returned to the city.

### **Thoughts:**

- > This is the **CTUX** of the story
- > Judah is now the leader
- > Judah is a changed man
- ➤ Benjamin is caught...what will Judah do? What will the other brothers do?

<u>Genesis 44:14</u> And Judah and his brethren came to Joseph's house; for he was yet there: and they fell before him on the ground. <u>Genesis 44:15</u> And <u>Joseph</u> said unto them, What deed is this that ye have done? wot ye not that such a man as I can certainly divine?

<u>Genesis 44:16</u> <u>And Judah said</u>, What shall we say unto my lord? what shall we speak? or how shall we clear ourselves...?

<u>Genesis 44:18</u> Then <u>Judah</u> came near unto him, and said, Oh my lord, let thy servant, I pray thee, speak a word in my lord's ears, and let not thine anger burn against thy servant: for thou art even as Pharaoh.

<u>Genesis 44:29</u> And <u>if</u> ye take this also from me, and mischief befall him, ye shall bring down my gray hairs with sorrow to the grave. <u>Genesis 44:30</u> Now therefore when I come to thy servant my father, and the lad be not with us; seeing that his life is bound up in the lad's life; <u>Genesis 44:31</u> It shall come to pass, when he seeth that the lad is not with us, that he will die: and thy servants shall bring down the gray hairs of thy servant our father with sorrow to the grave.

Genesis 44:32 For thy servant became surety for the lad unto my father, saying, If I bring him not unto thee, then I shall bear the blame to my father for ever. Genesis 44:33 Now therefore, I pray thee, let thy servant abide instead of the lad a bondman to my lord; and let the lad go up with his brethren. Genesis 44:34 For how shall I go up to my father, and the lad be not with me? lest peradventure I see the evil that shall come on my father.

<u>Philemon 17</u> <u>If</u> thou count me therefore a partner, receive him as myself. <u>Philemon 18</u> <u>If</u> he hath wronged thee, or oweth thee ought, put that on mine account;

### 5. God elevated Judah far beyond the problems!

<u>Genesis 49:3 Reuben</u>, thou art my firstborn, My might, and the beginning of my strength, The excellency of dignity, and the excellency of power: <u>Genesis 49:4</u> Unstable as water, thou shalt not excel; Because thou wentest up to thy father's bed; Then defiledst thou it: he went up to my couch.

Genesis 49:5 Simeon and Levi are brethren; Instruments of cruelty are in their habitations.

Genesis 49:6 O my soul, come not thou into their secret; Unto their assembly, mine honour, be not thou united: For in their anger they slew a man, And in their selfwill they digged down a wall. Genesis 49:7 Cursed be their anger, for it was fierce; And their wrath, for it was cruel: I will divide them in Jacob, And scatter them in Israel.

Genesis 49:8 Judah, thou art he whom thy brethren shall praise: Thy hand shall be in the neck of thine enemies; Thy father's children shall bow down before thee. Genesis 49:9 Judah is a lion's whelp: From the prey, my son, thou art gone up: He stooped down, he couched as a lion, And as an old lion; who shall rouse him up? Genesis 49:10 The sceptre shall not depart from Judah, Nor a lawgiver from between his feet, Until Shiloh come; And unto him shall the gathering of the people be.
