Romans 3:3 For what if some did not believe? shall their unbelief make the faith of God without effect?

Romans 3:4 God forbid: **yea, let God be true, but every man a liar**; as it is written, That thou mightest be justified in thy sayings, and mightest overcome when thou art judged.

A recognition: God is true

An admission: I'm not God / the truth

A **Submission**: Let God be true and every man a liar **including** me

<u>John 18:38</u> Pilate saith unto him, **What is truth?** And when he had said this, he went out again unto the Jews, and saith unto them, I find in him no fault at all.

<u>Deuteronomy 32:4</u> He is the Rock, his work is perfect: For all his ways are judgment: **A God of truth and without iniquity, Just and right is he.**

<u>Psalm 100:5</u> For the LORD <u>is good</u>; his <u>mercy</u> is everlasting; And his <u>truth</u> endureth to all generations. <u>Psalm 119:160</u> Thy word is true from the beginning: And every one of thy righteous judgments endureth for ever.

John 17:17 Sanctify them through thy truth: thy word is truth.

<u>John 14:6</u> Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, **the truth**, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.

Psalm 15:2 He that walketh uprightly, and worketh righteousness, And speaketh the truth in his heart.

Luke 10:29 But he, willing to justify himself, said unto Jesus, And who is my neighbour?

<u>Luke 11:27</u> And it came to pass, <u>as</u> he spake these things, a certain woman of the company lifted up her voice, and said unto him, **Blessed is the womb that bare thee, and the paps which thou hast sucked.**

<u>Luke 11:28</u> <u>But he said</u>, **Yea rather**, blessed are they that <u>hear</u> the word of God, and <u>keep</u> it.

The issues:

- ➤ Self-justification → **why**?
- ➤ More than willing to **change** the subject → **why**?

<u>Luke 14:12</u> Then said he also to him that bade him, **When thou makest a dinner or a supper**, call not thy friends, nor thy brethren, neither thy kinsmen, nor thy rich neighbours; lest they also bid thee again, and a recompence be made thee. <u>Luke 14:13</u> **But When thou makest a feast**, call the poor, the maimed, the lame, the blind: <u>Luke</u> 14:14 And thou shalt be blessed; for they cannot recompense thee: for thou shalt be recompensed at the

resurrection of the just. <u>Luke 14:15</u> And <u>when</u> one of them that sat at meat with him heard these things, he said unto him, Blessed is he that shall eat bread in the kingdom of God.
